SGAP Leaders: Idea Challenge Workshop

Isaiah was an engaged participant in the SGAP Leaders' Idea Challenge Workshop as one of 94 high school students. During the one-day challenge, students work in small mixed-school groups, facilitated by college students and faculty, to develop their own idea for a start-up social enterprise and present it to a panel of experienced social entrepreneurs. Students may choose to continue working on their idea after the workshop, then submit it as part of the Social Venture category of a High School Business Ideas Competition Awards event. The competition is an exciting process that grants up to \$500 in cash awards to winners.
